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From the Principal's Desk

This will be our last big newsletter for the 15/16 school year. Personally, I can't fathom how quickly this year has gone. Coming to North Cow Creek as the Superintendent/Principal has been, and continues to be, a highlight of my career. I am looking forward to the upcoming year and continuing to be a part of the great culture we have.

Traditionally, in the last newsletter, I like to highlight some of the things we did as a school to achieve our goals.

We enhanced our school culture through the following:

- Fine tuned our policies and procedures and worked hard to consistently enforce these.
- Initiated trimester assemblies to recognize students for improvement and academic honors.
- Initiated monthly recognition of students for possessing various positive habits.
- Initiated monthly "leadership" assemblies where we spent time talking about positive habits and how students could make these habits a part of their daily lives.
- Through the support of the Education Foundation we were able to bring outside individuals in to present leadership, music, and drama assemblies to the students.
- For our 7th and 8th grade students we recently implemented a Friday activity period where students can choose a topic of interest to participate in (archery, art, cooking, computer repair, drama, basketball, Photoshop).
- Implemented a 7th and 8th grade leadership team of students who have been assisting in identifying ways to enhance our middle school culture.
- Hired a full time computer lab teacher who works with all grade levels (K-8) each week.
- Hired a music teacher with students receiving weekly instruction in classroom music concepts.
- Fully implemented the "Everyday Math" curriculum.

For the upcoming year we will continue to build these areas in addition to working on adding more STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math) activities within the curriculum. We will also be continuing to incorporate the leadership theme and work to give students more opportunities to demonstrate leadership and character.

As a staff we are looking forward to seeing our parents at the many end-of-year activities that are coming up. We appreciate the participation of our families and the opportunity to serve the North Cow Creek students.

NO SHOTS? NO RECORDS? NO SCHOOL.

Under a new law known as SB 277, beginning January 1, 2016 requires that children be up-to-date on their immunizations (shots) to attend school. There are no personal belief exemptions or grace periods for children entering TK/ Kindergarten or advancing to 7th grade without immunizations.
